WHEN —

The Emma Scott Memorial Scholarships were established in 1961 by the Arkansas Education Association to honor Emma Scott. Miss Scott was a former English teacher in Little Rock and AEA staff member who is credited with establishing Future Teachers of America programs in Arkansas.



WHY —

The program annually offers three scholarships of \$500 each as an effective means of encouraging promising young people to enter the teaching profession.

HOW —

Funding for the scholarships is secured from:

- gifts from educational organizations and individuals interested in teacher recruitment
- memorial gifts from individuals and groups
- annual contributions of \$.25 per member from all FTA and S-AEA members

THE PROGRAM OFFERS —

- one scholarship to a junior or senior in a college teacher education program who is a member of Student AEA
- two scholarships to graduating high school seniors who plan to enter a teacher education program and who are members of FTA clubs affiliated with AEA.
