Applications for the 2012-2013 NEA ESP Leaders for Tomorrow program are now available. The first session will be held July 18-23, 2012 in Minneapolis, MN. The second session will be held November 8-11, 2012 in Washington, DC, and the third session (which includes attendance to the NEA ESP National Conference) will be held March 3-10, 2013 in Louisville, KY.

Attached are the application and a detailed overview of Leaders for Tomorrow, as well as qualifications for potential applicants. **Please note that all applicants must have a letter of acknowledgment signed by the State Affiliate President or Executive Director.** This letter is not an endorsement of the candidate, but rather an acknowledgement by state affiliate leadership that they are aware of who is applying. No applications will be accepted without this acknowledgment letter.

Leaders for Tomorrow is open to any NEA ESP member – from K-12 and Higher Education – who is currently an ESP member and who has been an NEA member in good standing for at least the last three years. In order to ensure that there is a strong pool of applicants, please assist us in distributing this information to all ESP members in your state. Also, please provide copies of the application and Leaders for Tomorrow description to all interested candidates. Information about Leaders for Tomorrow will be posted on NEA.org as well as on the ESP Listserv. However, communication at the state affiliate level is critical in getting the word out to all interested candidates.

Terms and Conditions for Acceptance

What is NEA ESP Leaders for Tomorrow?

NEA Leaders for Tomorrow program is a three session training process held over an eight month period that is open to dues paying NEA ESP members who meet the program's eligibility requirements. Candidates must be nominated for the program and have their application acknowledged and signed by their state Association.

NEA ESP Leaders for Tomorrow Eligibility Requirements

- Must be current NEA ESP member
- Must have been NEA member in good standing for the past three years
- Must complete application form and submit by the deadline
- Must commit to participate fully in all three sessions
- Must commit to utilize my new skills in my Association

Why Leaders for Tomorrow?

Leaders for Tomorrow will train both current and future leaders in leadership attitudes, skills and knowledge that will enhance their ability to be a visible, vocal advocate at the local, state and national levels of the NEA.

What will I learn?

The program is broken into eleven modules: Self Awareness and Self Management, Risk Taking and Change, Assertiveness, Communication, Resilience and Coping Skills, Political Activism, NEA Governance and Structure and Trade Unionism, Presentation Skills, Organizing, and Effective Meeting Skills. Participants in the program will:

- Identify personal strengths and weaknesses and learn how to utilize them as a leader
- Build skills in areas such as communication skills, organizing and recruitment, team building and presentation skills
- Learn how to use the structure, resources, culture and work of NEA effectively as a leader
- Learn how to engage members in politics
- Learn the history and importance of trade unionism
- Learn how to run an effective meeting
- Learn how to use the art of powerful questions
- Identify their risk taking style and risks leaders face
- Learn internal and external organizing skills
- Learn how to communicate effectively and how to make a presentation.

What kind of time commitment and resources does NEA ESP Leaders for Tomorrow require?

- There are three training sessions over an eight month period
 - July 18-22, 2012, Minneapolis, MN (Tentative)
 - November 8-11, 2012 Washington, DC
 - March 3-10, 2013 Louisville, KY, includes attendance to the NEA ESP National Conference.

- All participants are fully funded as allowed under the NEA travel guidelines, including transportation, lodging, meals and substitute pay or salary reimbursement, including attendance to the ESP conference.

What happens if I cannot attend all three sessions?

We understand that personal and professional emergencies can arise, however, it is expected that selected candidates will attend all sessions completely except in cases of an emergency. Nominees who are selected must complete the entire first session in order to attend the two subsequent sessions. If an emergency arises, Leaders for Tomorrow participants commit to notifying the NEA ESP program as soon as possible.
