memorial undergraduate scholarship

This \$500 scholarship is awarded yearly to five African-American college students in Arkansas. Each year this scholarship also honors the memory of a distinguished African-American educator. The deadline for scholarship applications is February 1. All applications must be completed with documents by the deadline. Otherwise the committee will not consider it.



ELIGIBILITY

Applicant must be:

- a member of Student-AEA
- an African-American junior or senior in an accredited teacher education program in an Arkansas college or university

ABOUT T.E. PATTERSON

AEA honors T.E. Patterson for his contributions to education in the form of a scholarship funded by the ATA Endowment Fund. Patterson served as Executive Secretary of the Arkansas Teachers Association, organizing such efforts as the ATA Citizen Education Program, urging African-Americans to vote. His term saw the construction of a new ATA headquarters and laid the groundwork for the merger of AEA and ATA.

ABOUT THE ATA ENDOWMENT PROGRAM

Funding for the scholarship is provided by the ATA Endowment Program as a living memorial to the Arkansas Teachers Association, which merged with AEA in 1969. The endowment also provides for the TW Coggs In-service Grant.

ATA was organized to secure equality of educational opportunities for every child and equality of professional status for every teacher in Arkansas. The Endowment provides motivation and development opportunities for young people of African-American descent who wish to enter the teaching profession, as well as advance the placement of qualified African-American educators in schools throughout Arkansas.

Following the merger of the Arkansas Education Association and Arkansas Teachers Association, the ATA Building was sold in July 1970. The net proceeds from the sale were invested, and the interest is used to finance this program.

The ATA Endowment Program is administered by a committee with a staggered membership to serve as a policy-making group for setting up and implementing the endowment program. The AEA Board shall set the criteria for persons serving on the Endowment Committee, and they shall be appointed by the AEA President, subject to the approval of the Board.
